CALL FOR SUBMISSION OF POSTERS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION AND CONTEXTUALIZATION OF THE EVENT

The **1st INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF LABOR LAW, TRADE UNION LAW AND SOCIAL RIGHTS** to be held between **November 29 to December 2, 2022**, in Manaus, at the Faculty of Law of the State University of Amazonas, will have, as its central theme, the challenges of democracy, labor and social rights in the world in transition.

The event is a result of the collaborative research partnership within the scope of the DINTER-Interinstitutional Doctorate of the Federal University of Minas Gerais - UFMG and the Amazon State University - UEA. The event is organized by the research group Work on the Move - TREM/UFMG. This research group is also connected to professors of DINTER and are coordinated by Prof. Dra. Maria Rosaria Barbato (who is also the Coordinator of Dinter) and Prof. Dr. Alcian Pereira de Souza, her deputy. The congress is a joint effort of professors and students of UFMG, UEA and Federal University of Amazonas - UFAM. The event will allow the consolidation of interinstitutional ties between the two institutions (UFMG and UEA), the partner institution (UFAM), and the supporting institutions.

The event proposes to facilitate interdisciplinary debates on the law and its political, regulatory, social, economic and normative dimensions. It also intends to provide opportunity for exchanging experiences, knowledge and views, from an interdisciplinary and transversal perspective that is both critical and reflective, about the thematic axis of labor law and social rights, including sociobiodiversity in the Amazonian context, also focusing on it's the improvement of this latter.

2. TARGET AUDIENCE

Undergraduate and graduate students of higher education institutions in law and related areas, professors, researchers, activists, specialists and others interested in the topics.

3. POSTERS

3.1. A poster is a visual resource in which the researcher presents a synthesis of the most relevant research information carried out or in progress.

3.2. The poster selected for exhibition and oral presentation shall comply with the following production guidelines:

3.2.1. Size: 1.10m high x 90cm wide;

3.2.2 Material: may be on paper, cardboard or even in products especially available for this purpose;

3.2.3. Display form: it must have a cord on top so that it can be hung.

3.3. As for the content, it must display:

3.3.1. Featured title (capital letters), the subtitle, if there is any, should be included after the title, separated by colon, written in lowercase letters.

3.3.2. Name of the authors (if it is necessary, the name of the funding entity) and their institutional affiliation;

3.3.3. Location where the research was or is being carried out;

3.3.4. Thematic line;

3.3.5. In the body of the poster: a) Introduction; b) Research problem; c) Objective; (d) Method; (e) Results Achieved; (f) References.

3.3.6. Citations (NBR 10520/2002) and references (NBR 6023/2018) must comply with ABNT rules, as well as the NBR 15437/2006.

4. STANDARDS THAT MUST BE OBSERVED FOR THE SUBMISSION OF POSTERS

4.1. Poster abstracts must be unpublished and have a maximum of 1000 words, (identifications and references will not be included in the 1000 words)

4.2. Abstracts must comply with ABNT standards.

4.2.1. Abstracts will be accepted (only in formats: .doc or .docx) in Portuguese, Italian, Spanish, French and English and if they are not shorter than 3 (three) pages and no longer than 4 (four) pages (A4 sheet, vertical position), including bibliography.

4.2.2. The title of the abstract shall be in the language in which it is written (Portuguese, Italian, Spanish, French and English) and in English.

4.2.3. Three to five keywords of the abstract shall be included.

4.2.4. The abstract shall contain: title, objectives, methodologies, research development, conclusions, keywords and references.

4.2.5. Formatting issues: Times New Roman; capitalized titles (in the original language and in English) in font 14, centralized, bold; body of text is in 12, justified alignment; without separation of syllables; spacing 1.5 between lines; paragraph 1.5 cm; top and left margins with 3 (three) cm and bottom and right with 2 (two) cm; and there should be no space between paragraphs.

4.2.6. Citations (NBR 10520/2002) and references (NBR 6023/2018) must comply with ABNT rules.

4.2.7. After submission of the posters, replacement, correction, alteration of the content or of any nature will not be permitted.

4.2.8. Abstracts submitted will undergo editorial analysis. Abstracts that fail to meet these abovementioned standards will be rejected.

4.2.9. The system for calling references of direct or indirect citations should be author-date (NBR 10520/2002), with footnotes being only explanatory (NBR 6022/2003).

4.2.10. Authors, when submitting their abstracts and posters, automatically assign and transfer irrevocably and free of charge all copyrights related to the work to the Ist International Congress of Labor Law, Trade Union Law and Social Rights, notably the rights of publication, reproduction, editing, adaptation, translation, distribution, printing, marketing, and others, provided for in art. 29 of Law 9.610/98, for editorial, commercial, educational, technical and cultural purposes, not consisting of any remuneration to them. The I International Congress of Labor Law, Trade Union Law and Social Rights is authorized to promote the editions, total or partial, that it deems opportune and in any number of copies, as well as the distribution and national or foreign circulation in any medium, of storage, , broadcasting and distribution of the work. The present assignment authorizes the I International Congress of Labor Law, Union Law and Social Rights, to transmit the rights of economic use of the work, contracting or authorizing its edition to third parties. It also allows, definitively and irrevocably, to assign these same rights that it now holds.

5. AUTHORS

5.1 Posters with a maximum of 02 (two) master authors, master, students, specialists, specialization students, graduates or undergraduates will be accepted. A third author may be administered only as the supervisor of the work and must necessarily be a master, doctoral student or doctor. The advisor will not be able to present the work.

5.2. The works of undergraduates, graduates and specialists will only be considered if written in co-authorship with at least one master/master's degree **and/or** PhD/doctoral student.

5.3. The author who submits the poster is responsible for including the name of the other author(s), as well as for defining the order in which the names are presented.

5.4. After submission of poster abstracts, inclusions of authors and changes in the order of names will not be accepted.

6. SUBMISSION OF POSTERS

6.1 Abstracts will be received until **September 23, 2022**, precisely until **11:59 pm**, Brasília time.

6.2 Each author may submit a maximum of 2 (two) abstracts, provided that they belong to a different Working Groups, according to Annex I. Different abstract must be sent to the indicated (different) email. If more than two abstracts are received per author, only the first 2 submissions in chronological order will be considered. If rejection happens for this reason, it could raise the liability of the author that submitted more abstracts than allowed towards his or her co-authors.

6.3. The e-mail sent for the submission of abstracts must also contain the address of the co-authors (including the mentoring co-author) all of whom must reply all recipients their consentment by email within 24 hours.

6.4 Each email sent must contain 2 (two) files. One with anonymous abstract, the other with the abstract with the full indication of the authors. Only in the identified file, the name of the author(s) should be included below the title with spacing of 1.5, aligned to the left. Below the full name, the title and institutional affiliation must be added.

6.5. The abstract shall indicate the Working Group. The Working Groups (WGs) are as follows: (Annex I)

21. Right to difference and self-determination of traditional peoples: constitutional and international protection in the Amazonian context.
22. Predatory capitalism and social issues in the Amazonian region: challenges for public policies and social rights.
23. Special WG: 4 chiacchiere e un caffè: uno sguardo alle migrazioni italiane in Amazzonia e in Brasile (A chat and a coffee: a look at the Italian migrations in the Amazonas and in Brazil)

6.6. Each abstract must be sent to the congressodireitossociais@gmail.com email, indicating in the subject of the email "ABSTRACT FOR THE WG (WG NUMBER AND NAME)". In the body of the e-mail, the following must be informed: 1) title of the work in the original language; 2) name of the WS; 3) full name of the author(s); 4) institution/city; 5) e-mail and phone number of the contact person.

6.7. After submission of the poster, replacement, correction, alteration of the content or of any nature shall not be allowed.

6.8 Abstracts of posters submitted will undergo editorial analysis. Those who do not comply with the rules of this notice will not be accepted for publication.

6.9. If there is interest in the submission of works in formats different from that described in this call (such as poems, artistic performances, short, etc.), an e-mail is required to be sent to the organizing committee congressodireitossociais@gmail.com informing them about the proposal, specifying the format and indication of the relevant WG.

7. EVALUATION

7.1 All submitted posters will be evaluated in two stages:

Step I - Reviewers will evaluate whether the posters comply with the requirements of the call.

Failure to do so will result in a rejection.

Step II – The posters approved by the reviewers will be forwarded to the evaluation committee, composed of 2 (two) evaluators doctors and / or doctoral candidates. Which will judge the merits of the work, according to the following criteria:

- a) Timeliness, originality and relevance of the theme.
- b) Relevance of the title and quality of the abstract.
- c) Theoretical consistency.
- d) Clarity, relevance and feasibility of the objectives.
- e) Methodology (adequacy and quality).
- f) Analysis of research data and results.
- g) Theoretical and methodological articulation of interpretation.
- h) Conclusions: foundation, coherence and coverage.

At the time of the face-to-face and oral presentation, in addition to the above-mentioned items, the following will also be evaluated:

- i) Visual presentation of the work.
- j) Oral presentation (content domain and clarity in presentation).
- l) Respect for presentation time (**5 minutes**).

7.2. The list of approved abstracts will be published on the <https://pos.uea.edu.br/direitoambiental> and <https://pos.direito.ufmg.br/> until **October 12, 2022**.

7.3. The number of 80 posters for face-to-face presentation is established.

7.4. An appeal against the final decision of the evaluation is not available at any stage of the process..

7.5. After the announcement of the chosen posters, their authors must send, until **October 19, 2022**,

a pdf file containing the image of the poster to be displayed on the day of presentation at the Congress, which will be checked at this time. It will however only be evaluated and scored during the face-to-face presentation.

8. EXHIBITION AND ORAL PRESENTATION

- 8.1. Posters with their approved abstracts must be displayed, according to point 3 of this call, and presented orally on the day and time to be established by the Organizing Committee (between November 29 and December 2) in a place reserved especially for this purpose.
- 8.2. The preparation, transport, exhibition, presentation and removal of the poster will be the sole responsibility of the author(s), being their responsibility the pinning and removal of the poster on the respective day provided for its presentation block.
- 8.3. 05 (five) minutes per poster will be available for presentation during which audiovisual resources cannot be used. There will be 02 (two) presentations required for each poster.
- 8.4. The evaluations related to this item will be carried out by 02 (two) evaluators, at different times or simultaneously.
- 8.5. Only the properly registered Author(s) will be allowed to present their respective posters.
- 8.6. The author who submits both a poster and an expanded abstract may have their presentations scheduled at the same time. In this case, they must choose between presenting either the poster or the extended abstract.
- 8.7. If there are more than one author of either the poster or the extended abstract, they can make their presentations individually in their respective WGs.

9. DECLARATIONS, PUBLICATIONS AND CERTIFICATES

- 9.1. The authors of the posters participating in the presentation at the event, in the day, time and place to be established by the Organizing Committee will receive a exhibitor's certificate.
- 9.2. The Organizing Committee, may decide on the publication of the posters mentioning the respective authors and the event, in digital or printed form, in the Anals of the event or in another publications.
- 9.3. The author who submitted his work and signed the attendance list on the day of the presentation will receive a certificate of presentation.
- 9.4. All poster presenters, participants and duly registered audience will receive a certificate of participation in the event, if the maintain at least 75% attendance
- 9.5. It will be up to all registrants to record their attendance daily at the points indicated for this purpose.
- 9.6. For the purpose of counting percentage of frequency, it was agreed every day of the event, according to the official schedule.

10. BEST POSTER AWARD

- 10.1 Best poster award will be given to the 5 (five) best posters receiving the highest overall score.
- 10.2. In the event of a tie, each will be awarded.
- 10.3. The Award Statement will be sent until by **January 15 2023**.

11. THE REGISTRATIONS AT THE EVENT

- 11.1. The registration fee for the presentation of abstracts and participation as an audience is R\$ 70.00 (seventy reais) if paid between October, 13 and November 1, 2022 and R\$ 100.00 (one hundred reais), if it is paid between November 2, 2022 and November 10, 2022.
- 11.2. For undergraduates, the registration fee for the presentation of the representations and participation as an audience is R\$ 20.00 (twenty reais), if paid between October, 13 until November 1 and R\$ 30.00 (thirty reais), if paid between November 2 and November 10, 2022.
- 11.3. Regardless of the number of abstracts approved, participants pay a single fee.



11.4. The organizing committee will not refund payments or transfer them to third parties under any circumstances.

11.5. Registered participants may attend the event as audience. In this case, they will receive a certificate of participation, provided that they have attended at least 75% of the sessions of the event.

11.6. The organizing committee will inform about the modalities of delivery of certificates and declarations.

11.7. The registration fee must be paid exclusively through the Sympla events platform. The payment access link will be made available by the organizing committee from October 12, 2022.

12. FINAL PROVISIONS

12.1. The non-observance of the provisions contained in this call during or after the event, will result in the refusal of the abstract and the poster. This decision is made by the organizing committee. In the case of refusal, there is no refund made and no certificate is issued.

12.2. The organizing committee reserves the right to resolve, at its discretion, any issues relating to question of interpretation or application of this call, its alleged errors, redundancies or omissions.

12.3. It is the full responsibility of the author(s) to respect the rules stipulated in this call, as well as the monitoring of the notifications of the organizing committee about the details of the event, which will be sent by e-mail and made available at the websites.

12.4. Changes to dates may be made in sequence and published on the websites.
